From the Director

Why Do Parents Choose a Charter School?

Why did you choose a charter school for your child? This question was posed to hundreds of parents in Columbus, Ohio who are choosing to enroll their children in area charter schools. The top five responses to this were as follows:*

- Discipline, safety and dress: 42%
- Individual attention : 42%
- Specific, unmet academic/physical needs: 39%
- Quality of education in general: 30%
- Communication: 9%

While these are not all the reasons parents make the choice, it is important to note that school safety is the top concern. With so much bad news in the world around this issue, it is important as a parent to feel as though your child is safe *at* school and safe *in* school as well. Our own annual parent surveys match these numbers almost exactly.

School safety falls into two categories. The first is physical safety. Here at Crown Pointe Academy we oversee this is by having a very secure school safety plan: locked doors, controlled single point of entry, two-way radios, security cameras in the hallways and outside, two-deep classroom and playground supervision, lockdown and lockout procedures, and a unique pickup and drop off system. All of these pieces come together to create a complete plan that ensures that the school is focuses on making student safety a priority.

The second piece of the puzzle occurs inside the school. This involves student discipline, bully prevention, and an active response to problems. Student discipline is both an art and science. It requires active listening skills, fairness, empathy, and instruction. It can sometimes be a mystery to some parents how issues get resolved because of confidentiality, but the process always involves these four elements. Bully prevention is another mixture of talents where experience is an essential element. Our staff, led by our counselor Mrs. Knutson, makes sure a proactive direction is taken to stop problems either before they occur or as soon as we become aware of them. The final step is taking quick, direct action to handle problems early on so they don't become bigger issues.

All of these strategies are used to ensure that Crown Pointe has a solid approach to school safety. All of this effort is essential in making sure that we can perform our other mission of educating students. Is all of this effort and focus really necessary? Absolutely, and it is one of the main reasons parents choose Crown Pointe.

State Mandated Tests are Fast Approaching!

Students in grades 3-8 will be completing the Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) testing between April 8th-26th. Most grade levels have six tests in English Language Arts and Math that take between 65 and 110 minutes each to complete. Additionally, students in grades 5 and 8 will complete testing in science, which includes three tests that take approximately 80 minutes each.

Your child's attendance on these testing dates is essential. We encourage you not to schedule any activities that require your child to be absent during the testing days. We know that you are aware that your child's participation on these tests is very important, so please take time to review the following testing tips with him/her:

- Make sure your child is well rested for school, especially on the day of the test;
- Provide a hearty breakfast on the morning of the test;
- Be sure your child arrives on time to school each day and attends regularly;
- Encourage your child to do his/her best;
- Remember it's important not to judge your child on the basis of a single test score. It's more important to focus on progress over a marking period than on the results of one test.
- Contact your child's teacher whenever you have questions about his/her progress, including test results.

Please take time to remind your child of the following test taking strategies as the test approaches:

- Stay calm. Some students find it helpful to relax themselves with a couple of slow, deep breaths before they begin the test;
- Read and/or listen carefully to directions from the teacher before beginning the test;
- Begin as soon as you can and complete the test exactly as you are told to do;
- Read each question and all possible answers before selecting the correct one;
- Check over the test at the end of the test session to be sure that you have answered all the questions; and
- Keep working until time is up. If you finish early, go back and check your answers.
