From the Director

Change Is Coming - A Brief History of School Lunch at CPA

School lunch has always been a tricky proposition. You have to feed a couple of hundred picky kids with rules and regulations that make it tough to make everyone happy. Since salt and fat limits are mandated, healthier options make it nearly impossible to compete with fast food, soda, and salty snacks. At CPA, we've struggled to find a way to get kids to eat school lunch on a regular basis and each year, we look for an option that get more kids eating lunch.

When the school started 22 years ago there was no school lunch program. Parents packed their child's lunch every day. After about 6 years, the school decided to go with Adams County School District 50's food service. This worked for a while, but because of budget cuts, the school lunch program was eventually taken over by an outside company. The food was often tasteless, beige, and under sized.

Crown Pointe looked for an alternative and found one. Working with a new company, initially the food was tastier, portions were larger for middle school, and more kids were eating school lunch. Over the last few years, the quality and quantity declined, kids stopped eating it, and again we looked for an alternative.

We are pleased to report that we have found one. Next year CPA will partner with the Boulder Valley School District as our food service provider. After comparing the BVSD program to ours, we found their lunches to be bigger, better, and include a daily salad bar. They offer more options, larger portions for middle school, and serve the food "family style". (This means that they come on trays not individual packages with milk coming in cups not cartons.) In general, the meals just taste better.

With this change we will be hiring our own staff. Today we posted two jobs – a 6 hour and a 4 hour cook/server. Anyone interested in applying can check out posting on the school's website under "employment".

One of the special things about a charter school is that fact that we can make a change like this. We can go out there and see if there is something better for our students. In this case it's lunch, but if more kids eat it and like it, then it was worth the effort.

- A water bottle


Be advised! Students MAY get wet, so they need to dress appropriately!

End of Year Information

The school calendar for next year is on the school's website. We will send a copy of the calendar along with next year's school supply list in your child's report card envelope the last day of school for elementary students, or mailed home for middle school students. If your child will not be in school the last day of school, you can stop by the school during the month of June (Monday-Thursday only) to pick up the report card.

As we make plans for the start of the next school year, please watch for your summer mailing in July, which will include information about registration, your student's class teacher, and your testing time for August 12th or 13th (elementary students only).

Some students will have fees and/or fines to pay before the end of the year. Lists of fees and/or fines owed will be sent home throughout the next four weeks. Included in the fees and fines will be fines that were not paid at the end of last year, beginning of year fees that were not paid, costs of lost or damaged textbooks, lunch money due, library charges for overdue books, or lost library books charges. We will also let you know if you have a balance in your child's lunch account. If you owe fees or fines, you can pay them at the front office.
